

Florida Registry Requirements are for Life		
<u>Count of Requirements</u>	<u>Added</u>	<u>Registration Requirement</u>
1	1997	Report within 48 Hours after establishing a permanent or temporary residence
2	1997	Registration must include name, date of birth, race, sex, height, weight, hair and eye color, tattoos or other identifying marks, address of permanent or legal residence
3	1997	Report to DHSMV within 48 hours after change in address.
4	1998	Additional qualifying offenses
5	1998	Registration must include Social security number, occupation and place of employment, rural route address and a post office box, post office box cannot be used in lieu of physical residential address, written notice of vehicle identification number, license tag number, registration number, a description including color scheme, hull identification number, manufacturer's serial number, name of vessel, registration number and description including color scheme
6	1998	Address verification at residence
7	1998	Internet notification
8	1998	Ability to Petition for removal 20 years AFTER all sanctions are completed
9	2000	Must report out-of-state addresses
10	2000	County/local law enforcement must verify address.
11	2002	Additional qualifying offenses
12	2002	Persons subject to registration in another state must register
13	2002	Must register enrollment in an institution of higher education
14	2002	Must report employment within 48 hours
15	2002	Registrants visiting from out of state will be on FL for life.
16	2004	Must provide address for temporary address
17	2004	If you reported a change in address and fail to vacate, 2nd degree felony.
18	2004	Strict Liability - can be prosecuted for unknowing violations
19	2004	Registration after arrest not a defense
20	2004	Residency Restrictions - Cannot live w/l 1000 ft of school, park, playground or daycare center
21	2005	Semi-Annual registration required
22	2007	Additional qualifying offenses
23	2007	Registration of Email Address, IM and Internet Identifiers required
24	2007	Quarterly registration for some
25	2007	Branded drivers' licenses
26	2007	Certain enumerated offenses can never petition for removal
27	2007	5 more years before one can petition for removal (hence cannot petition for removal for 25 years AFTER all sanctions are completed)
28	2009	Home and cellphone numbers must be registered
29	2010	"Transient residence" must be reported every 30 days
30	2012	Additional qualifying offenses
31	2013	Fingerprints and photographs required
32	2014	Additional qualifying offenses
33	2014	Internet Identifiers including URLs must be reported before using
34	2014	Vehicles at residence must be registered
35	2014	Vehicles leased or rented must be registered
36	2014	Palm Prints must be taken at registration
37	2014	Year, Make, Model, Mile, VIN, Tag of vehicles must be reported

38	2014	Passports are marked
39	2014	Must report Immigration status (Citizenship)
40	2014	Professional licenses must be reported
41	2014	Volunteer Status must be reported
42	2014	Additional Genetic Markers (DNA Sample) must be provided
43	2014	Transients must report every 30 days.
44	2014	Report 21 days before leaving the country.
45	2016	Additional qualifying offenses
46	2016	Online reporting of Internet IDs, phone numbers, employment education.
47	2016	Expanded international travel reporting.
48	2017	Corresponding website, homepage or application software for each Internet Identifier must be reported.
49	2018	Reduced residence reporting to 3 days from 5.
50	2018	Mandatory minimum sentence for Failure to Register (FTR)
51	2018	Mandatory GPS monitoring for Failure to Register (FTR)
52	2020	No timesharing with own children absent Judge's written finding.
